The Government of Kosovo (GoK) has received a Credit from the International Development Association (IDA) in the amount of EUR 20 million to finance the Kosovo Comprehensive Approach to Health System Strengthening Project (KOMPAS) and intends to apply part of the proceeds to payments for goods, works, non-consulting services, and consulting services to be procured under this Project.

The Ministry of Health will be responsible for the overall coordination of the Project.

The Project Development Objective (PDO) is to strengthen institutional capacity and governance for quality of care in the Kosovo health system. The project will include the following components:

Component 1. Strengthening key health system building blocks for Quality of Care (QoC).

The objective of this component is to support aspects of public health/PPR, service delivery, and health financing (strategic purchasing), that will help unblock the bottlenecks in structural and process of care.

1.1 Improving service delivery.

1.2 Developing and implementing strategic purchasing for quality.

1.3. Strengthening public health and Pandemic Preparedness and Response (PPR)

Component 2. Supporting households to comply with public health containment measures.

The objective of this component is to support the design, development, and implementation of an integrated digital health ecosystem that is critical for the functioning of the entire health system.

2.1 Establishing foundational building blocks of the Integrated Health Information System (IHIS)

2.2. Digital health support for improvement in QoC

2.3. Implementation of IHIS strategic systems

Component 3. Project management. Provision of Support for overall project administration, including project management, fiduciary functions (procurement, financial management (FM)), monitoring and evaluation, environmental and social compliance, and regular monitoring of and reporting on project implementation

The main contracts to be financed under the project are the following:

Contracting Works:

- Construction/adaptation of safe storage spaces (warehouses) for infectious and sharp waste, Construction/renovation of follow-up infrastructure for treatment of medical waste (MW);

- Renovation of the central warehouse of pharmaceutical waste;

Procurement of Goods

- Procurement of equipment and supplies for Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR) and Infection Prevention and Control (IPC)
- Procurement of autoclaves for medical waste treatment to replace outdated equipment and Procurement of transport vehicles for medical waste (MW);

Contracting consultants:

- Developing/Standardizing quality and safety standards and work plans;
- Training, capacity building, and clinical guidelines development for health care professionals;
- Basic Benefits Package (BBP) development, including outpatient drug benefits package implementation guidance
- Supervision of renovation works of the central warehouse of pharmaceutical waste.

Contracting IT/Software Development Firms

- HMIS (Hospital MIS) design and implementation.
- Health Information Exchange HIE (assessment/design and investment in system);
- Central Electronic Health Record EHR (design and implementation);

The procurement of project activities will be governed and carried out in accordance with the World Bank's Procurement Regulations for IPF Borrowers (Sixth Edition, February 2025) for the supply of goods, works, non-consulting and consulting services, and is open to all eligible firms and individuals as defined in the *Procurement Regulations*.
