ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL COMMITMENT PLAN

1. The Republic of Kosovo (hereinafter the **Recipient**) shall implement the Kosovo Emergency COVID-19 Response Project(P173819); including activities to be supported under the additional financing (P176661) for the Project (**Project**), with the involvement of the Ministry of Health (**MoH**) and Ministry of Finance Labour and Transfer (MoFLT). The International Development Association (hereinafter the **Association**) has agreed to provide financing for the Project.
2. The Recipient shall implement material measures and actions so that the Project is implemented in accordance with the Environmental and Social Standards (**ESSs**). This Environmental and Social Commitment Plan (**ESCP**) sets out material measures and actions, any specific documents or plans, as well as the timing for each of these.
3. The Recipient is responsible for compliance with all requirements of the ESCP even when implementation of specific measures and actions is conducted by the Ministries referenced in 1. above.
4. Implementation of the material measures and actions set out in this ESCP shall be monitored and reported to the Association by the Recipient as required by the ESCP and the conditions of the legal agreement, and the Association shall monitor and assess progress and completion of the material measures and actions throughout implementation of the Project.
5. As agreed by the Association and the Recipient this ESCP may be revised from time to time during Project implementation, to reflect adaptive management of Project changes and unforeseen circumstances or in response to assessment of Project performance conducted under the ESCP itself. In such circumstances, the Recipient shall agree to the changes with the Association and shall update the ESCP to reflect such changes. Agreement on changes to the ESCP shall be documented through the exchange of letters signed between the Association and the Recipient. The Recipient shall promptly disclose the updated ESCP.
6. Where Project changes, unforeseen circumstances, or Project performance result in changes to the risks and impacts during Project implementation, the Recipient shall provide additional funds, if needed, to implement actions and measures to address such risks and impacts, which may include environmental, health, and safety impacts; community health and safety risks due to increased risk of exposure to COVID-19 virus and poor management of medical waste and the possible use of military and/or security personnel; social risks relating to accessibility and inclusion, social conflict arising due to the limited availability of the vaccines; and risks of sexual abuse and exploitation and sexual harassment (SEA/H) among others.

1.1	<p>ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE: As part of the Additional Finance the implementation arrangements of the parent Project, Kosovo Emergency Covid-19 Project (173819) will remain unchanged. In addition, the PCU under the MoH should be strengthened through the hiring of a short term OHS specialist/consultant and medical waste management specialist/consultant. Under the Project, the PCU shall hire a part time medical waste expert to provide input of the extension of the medical waste disposal facility in the medical centers as well as part time OHS expert. The Project related social due diligence shall be managed by the communication consultancy to be hired through the Project either as a company or individual consultant. The existing PCU shall continue to maintain qualified staff and resources to support management of ESHS risks and impacts of the Project including already hired environment and specialist. The Environmental specialist has been hired under the ongoing Kosovo Health Project ("KHP") (P147402) and the same specialist shall be responsible for the E&OHS management of this Project.</p>	<p>The PCU in MoH has recruited environmental and OHS specialist under the ongoing health project KHP (P147402).
